

UNDERSTANDING EMOTIONS

Encourage your child to use the **I FEEL...** section to reflect regularly on how they feel. This helps them identify and express their emotions and feelings!

As your child chooses and places an emotion magnet on the calendar, ask them open-ended questions to facilitate conversation.

What made you feel this way? How does this make your body feel?

I feel...

Remove the magnets from the bottom section of the calendar to use it as a white board. You could use it to track your activities, draw freely, and so much more.

Use a dry erase marker to plan out your week!



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Get creative and use the magnets to teach connections between different concepts!

Once your child has understood these basic concepts, go further and explore more complex questions together!

UNDERSTANDING TIME

By using the **TODAY'S ACTIVITIES** section, your child will connect activities to specific points of the day. This helps them understand how 24 hours can be divided throughout a day: between **MORNING**, **AFTERNOON**, and **EVENING** and between **a.m.** and **p.m.** Understanding these basic concepts is the first step in learning how to tell time.

As your child places an activity magnet on the board, relate it to a meal and time of day.

Use time-related words like before and after to help your child understand sequencing.

You can also help your child learn the days of the week by linking them to weekly activities!

On Monday, you have soccer lessons.

Use a dry erase marker to write your own activities and special events!

Abstract concepts like time, temperature, and seasons can be challenging for kids to understand. This calendar helps them visualize these concepts—it comes with magnets they can see and move around! It can also equip your child with organizational skills by introducing the habit of daily planning into their routine.

UNDERSTANDING MONTHS & SEASONS

The month magnets are color-coded to match with their corresponding season—use them to help your child connect the concepts of months and seasons!

Teach your child the months of the year by connecting them to specific occasions.

Once they're familiar with the concept, start asking them questions.

Halloween is in October.

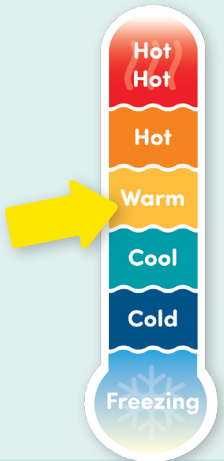


UNDERSTANDING TEMPERATURE

The calendar's thermometer is a great tool for teaching your child temperature-related vocabulary. It provides them with a visual aid and words to describe varying degrees of hot and cold.

Allow your child to feel different temperatures in a safe environment—you could use ice cubes, warm water, and something cool from the fridge.

Ask your child to describe how the temperature feels outside. Then, ask them to put the arrow magnet on the thermometer accordingly.

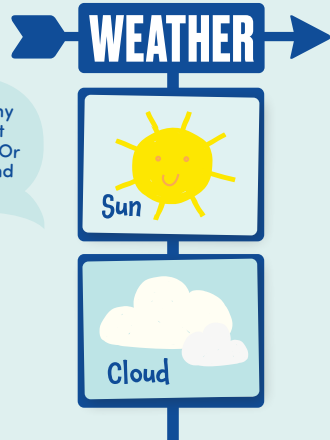


UNDERSTANDING WEATHER

Help your child identify and describe weather by using the weather magnets.

Encourage your child to connect weather to other concepts, like temperature and seasons.

Is it sunny and hot outside? Or sunny and cold?
