FREE PLAY
Encourage your child to play around with the ladybug and pegs as they please! They'll be improving their fine motor skills and developing the strength they'll need for a firm tripod grip.

## RECOGNITION

 ACTIVITIESHold up a peg and ask your child what color it is.

Insert all the pegs into the ladybug.
Call out a color, then ask your child to remove all the pegs in that color.

Lay out the pegs and ask your little one to identify the color of each one.

## COUNTING

ACTIVITIES
Ask your toddler how many holes they see in the ladybug's wings.

Ask your toddler to open the ladybug's wings and count the pegs inside.

Call out a number from 1 to 10 , then ask your little one to count out the same number of pegs and put them in the ladybug.

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
